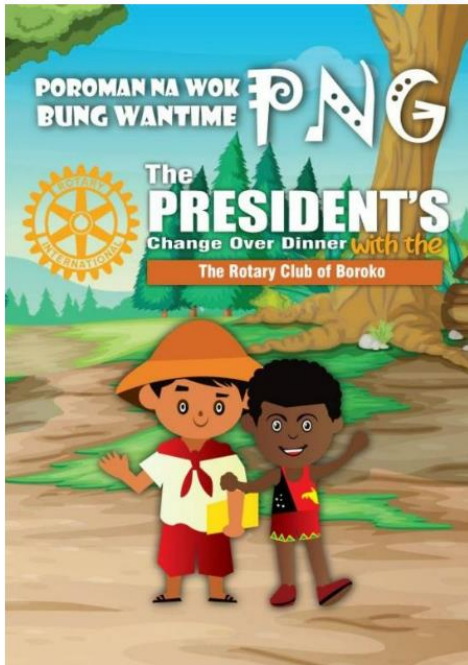

## 2022 Melbourne Cup: Committee Chairman Treasurer Sanjay Shah, MBE



The event was well organized and became a success due to the leadership, commitment and dedication of our members with the exceeding support of our Treasurer and Melbourne Cup Committee Chairman Sanjay Shah and his team in Supreme Industries.

The 2022 Melbourne Cup fundraising luncheon was one of the biggest fundraising events in the history of the Rotary Club and Papua New Guinea (PNG). Thanks to the generous support of our corporate partners, fellow Rotarians, friends, and family of Rotarians, the event was a tremendous success. The luncheon was held last November 1st, 2022, at the Hilton Hotels function room in Port Moresby. It was sponsored by over 50 organizations and attended by more than 550 guests.

We are delighted to announce that our proceed was K382,386.36 from sponsored tables, sweeps tickets, & auction sale. After deducting expenses for the venue, food, drinks, and entertainment, we were able to generate K232,769.42, which is significant funds for our cause. The combined efforts of our club members, family, and friends especially played a crucial role in the success of this event.

Furthermore, the presence of our District Governor Tim Kelley (2022-23) and Past District Governor Darryl Iseppi from our district (District 9620) added to the significance of the luncheon. Their participation and support made the event even more remarkable.

## 2022 Sausae Sizzle: Committee Chairman President Joselito Tubon, MBA



The Rotary Club of Boroko sponsored and supported the fundraising activity of Buk Bilong Pikinini (2022 Sausage Sizzles) in CHM Corporate Park Tech Haus in Gordon's for two consecutive Saturdays in December 2022. RCB provided buns, sausages, onions, and all the necessary ingredients. Some Rotarians and friends of Rotarians from Pacific Services Group, Fathima Ltd, and CHM Group also assisted the Buk Bilong Pikinini team in preparing and selling the sausages at K5.00. Buk Bilong Pikinini raised over K2,000.00 in profit during the fundraising event. The funds were used to support Buk Bilong Pikinini's day-to-day operations. Additionally, RCB distributed hand sanitizers and reading glasses during the sausage sizzles at CHM Corporate Park to make the fund raising activity more fun and exciting.

## 2023 Bowling Challenge: Committee Chairman President Joselito Tubon, MBA



The third fundraising activity of RCB this year was our Rotary Club of Boroko Family Day, which took place on June 10, 2023, at Lamana Lanes. A total of 18 teams, consisting of 36 players, participated in the 10-Pin Bowling Challenge. Companies associated with RCB members or friends of Rotarians registered teams to support the event at a fee of K1,500 per team. Our gross income was K25,500.00, after deducting expenses, leaving us with a net of K17,126.47 raised funds. ## Sogeri Community Water Project: Project Manager IPP Trevor Birney

The Sogeri Community Water project has been successfully completed this year. We secured funding of USD 100,000.00 for this project from the Rotary Foundation, which is equivalent to PGK 371,656.11. A total of K300,053.30 was utilized for the project. As a result, a surplus of PGK 71,602.81 or USD 20,048.79 will be returned to the Rotary Foundation.



## School Desks Project : Project Manager PADG Lionel Melville, MBE



Our school desk project is currently underway due to the increasing demand for school desks in the country. We have allocated K100,000.00 annually for this project. With each sheet of 18mm plywood, we can produce either 3 single school desks or 3 double desks using 2 sheets of 18mm plywood. We have been in discussions with several Rotary clubs for potential assistance, and we have received financial support from Australia. The materials required for this project include 18mm plywood, screws, and liquid nails. Thus far, the following schools have benefited from this initiative:

1. Bavaroko Elementary School
2. Evedahana Primary School
3. 14 Mile Elementary School
4. New Erima
5. Tubusereia Elementary School

*We have been continuously receiving requests from different schools.*

## YULE Island Water: Community Service Director Vhagi Gairowagga



We provided four 10,000-liter tanks to Yule Island to support the local villages in accessing clean spring water for their day-to-day needs. Previously, villagers had to carry buckets or containers over kilometers of distance every day to fetch water. However, with the installation of gravity-fed water pipes and water tanks, this laborious tasks was eliminated. The tanks and new pipes have received great appreciation from the local community and have significantly improved their access to clean water. We are proud to have contributed to this project.



## Community Service: Tutu Beach Community Library Project



We donated K20,000.00 for the construction of a new community library in Tutu Beach, through Dame Carol Kidu. This library will greatly benefit the young people in the community, providing them with a valuable resource for learning and education at the early stage. With the increasing rate of petty crimes in the country, we believe that early learning in the village will reduce, if not completely zero out.

## Teachers in a Box: Project Manager Hon Sec Russel Jackson



The Teachers In A Box server is specifically designed to function without internet connectivity and instead provides a Local Area Network (LAN) to enable device connectivity to the box. This is particularly beneficial in many rural villages in developing countries where internet access is limited, unreliable, or cost-prohibitive. The Teacher in a Box initiative has a tremendously positive impact in areas where teaching resources are scarce or where teachers themselves have limited training or education. Our Teacher in a Box server facilitates both self-paced learning and classroom teaching, providing valuable academic opportunities.

## Community Service: Distribution of RARE (Donation In Kind) Items

They are also managing our warehousing and logistics. This donation in kind values K50,000.00 per year.*

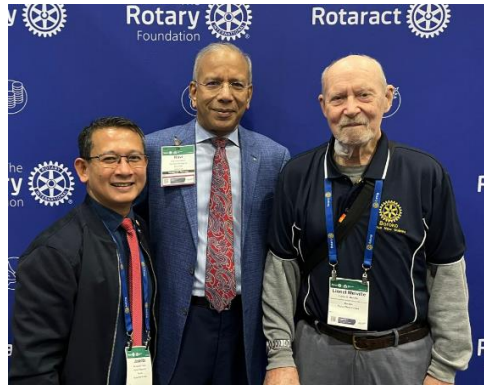

### RC Boroko Financial Report for the Year 2022-23

#### Income:

We are delighted to share that with the unwavering support of our members and sponsors, the Rotary Club of Boroko (RCB) successfully raised a total of PGK 589,971.35 during the year 2022-23. The major fundraising events, the Melbourne Cup and Ten Pin Bowling, played a significant role in contributing to our success, generating a net income of K 232,469.42 and K 15,626.47, respectively. Additionally, we received invaluable support from District grants, Clubs in Australia, Covid-19 reimbursements, and local corporate sponsors. Their contributions were instrumental in enabling us to fulfill our objectives, including delivering School Desks, Libraries, Clean Water, Health and Hygiene programs, Midwife Training, and supporting various institutions.

#### Expenses

During the year, major funds were allocated to various impactful projects, which were successfully executed by our dedicated team. The are as follows

**Wheelchair Procurement:** PGK 102,426.00, providing mobility support to those in need.

**RARE (DIK) Container:** PGK 276,849.00 dedicated to shipping vital resources such as Books , Health Equipment Hygenie products.

**Sogeri School & Yule Island Water Project:** PGK 89,304.00, clean potable water.

**School Desk Project:** PGK 60,521.00 directed towards improving school facilities.

3. Lese Oalai Composting Toilets – we have commitment as a host club for the constructions of 20 composting toilets in the Lese Oalai School.
4. School Desk project – we have allocated K100,000.00 a year
5. Teachers in a Box – A 3 TIB server will be supplied to Kikori, Central Province and in Sogeri.
6. Wheelchair Foundation for 120x wheelchairs amounting to K51,213.00
